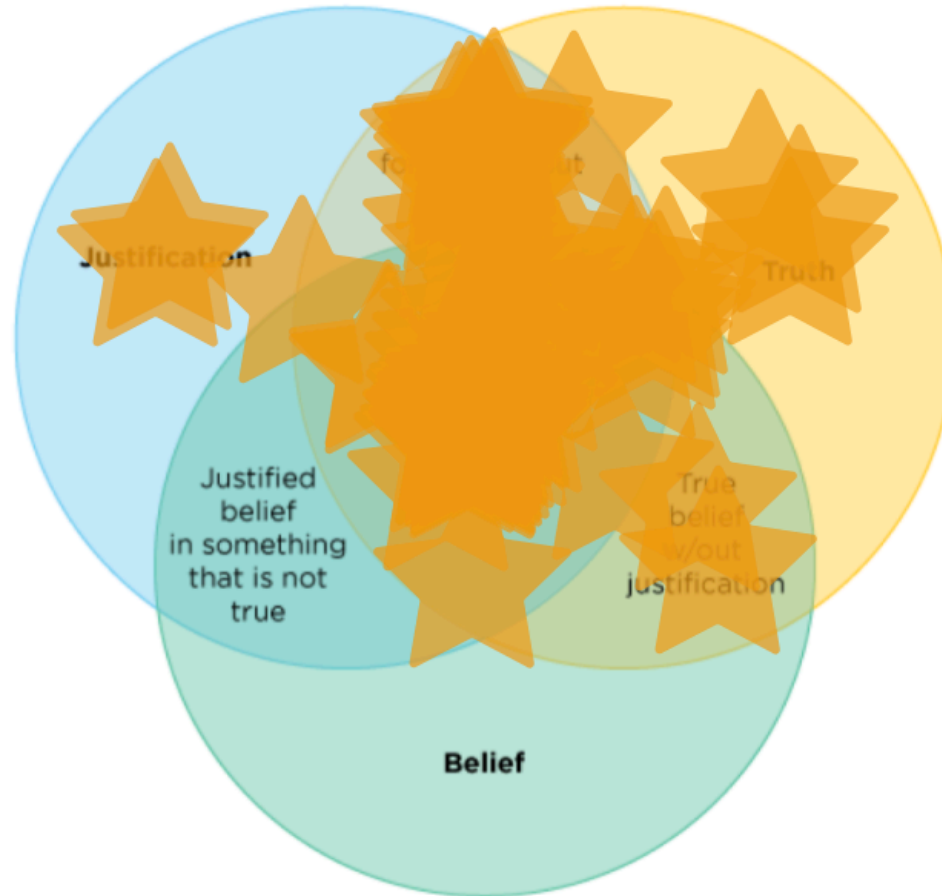


Drag your star to where you think **FACTS** belong on this diagram
